

Withdrawing With God: See The Need

Spending Time Alone With A Loved One Provides The Opportunity To Truly Know That Person

Luke 5:12-15 - In one of the villages, Jesus met a man with an advanced case of leprosy. When the man saw Jesus, he bowed with his face to the ground, begging to be healed. "Lord," he said, "if you are willing, you can heal me and make me clean." ¹³ Jesus reached out and touched him. "I am willing," he said. "Be healed!" And instantly the leprosy disappeared. ¹⁴ Then Jesus instructed him not to tell anyone what had happened. He said, "Go to the priest and let him examine you. Take along the offering required in the law of Moses for those who have been healed of leprosy. This will be a public testimony that you have been cleansed." ¹⁵ But despite Jesus' instructions, the report of his power spread even faster, and vast crowds came to hear him preach and to be healed of their diseases.

<u>Luke 5:16</u> - But Jesus often withdrew to the wilderness for prayer. (Bold underline added)

<u>Matthew 26:41</u> - Keep watch and pray, so that you will not give in to temptation. For the spirit is willing, but the body is weak!

<u>Luke 4:42-44</u> - Early the next morning Jesus went out to an isolated place. The crowds searched everywhere for him, and when they finally found him, they begged him not to leave them. ⁴³ But he replied, "I must preach the Good News of the Kingdom of God in other towns, too, because that is why I was sent." ⁴⁴ So he continued to travel around, preaching in synagogues throughout Judea.
